Thursday The 24th

The first part of these twenty four hours begins with fresh wind from N.W. We are heading up the bay black fish have for the first time gone in the middle and latter part light wind from west wood land

Lat by obs 32:25 S
Long by Do 15:25 E

Friday The 25th

Begins with light wind from the northeast and we heading West. We are in place in ships duty middle and latter part strong wind from N.W. land

Saturday The 26th

Begins with strong wind from N.W. we heading to the south under double reef in place in taking out the black fish which turn out 4 fish middle and latter part moderate gale from S.W. land

Lat by obs 32:20
Long by Do 13:35 E

Sunday The 30th

Begins with strong wind from S.W. we heading N.W. under double reef middle and latter part strong wind and heavy swell and much rain in the bay

Remarks On Board Ship Bakt. Gosnold

December 31st 1866

The first part of these twenty four hours begins with strong wind from S.W. and much weather we steer West & S.W. to pass under moderate sail middle and latter part strong wind and much weather. This day we been in place in repairing the main gale sail land
