Begain with light winds from South and we heading to the westward under all sail at 3 P.M. saw a school of Spotted Whales heading to S.W. going quite land side then and got 3 at 6.00 and the last one along side at 5.11 we commenced cutting at 11.00 we finished with our first fine Seals

Tuesday The 8th

Begain with light air and fine weather we heading to the westward in place in the morning out with our better part Calm and fine weather heading to the S.W. Seals

Begain with Calm and fine weather we begin in place in the morning out at 4 and 25.11 P.M. saw a school of Spotted Whales going to the westward land side for them at 3 return with our Successes with our better part Squally weather saw a seal Seals

January Thursday The 10th of 1867

The first part of these twenty four hours began with moderate wind from S.W. and squally weather we heading to the westward and moderate sail in place in the morning out at 4 P.M. we finished with turn out to 11.00 at 11.00 Short in sail and lay too all night with our better part fine Seals

Thursday The 11th

Begain with light wind from S.W. and we heading to the S.W. in place in the morning out at 4 P.M. Short in sail and lay too to the westward at 7 P.M. Spent the big area of Seagabor & many out 30 Miles Spent latter part Squally and rainy weather Seals

Friday The 12th

Begain with light air and fine weather then we begin in place in the morning out at 4 P.M. Short in sail and lay too to the westward at 7 P.M. Spent the big area of Seagabor & many out 30 Miles Spent latter part Squally and rainy weather Seals

Long by do 04:30 W
