

Bound To New Zealand March 1867

Monday The 12th

The first part of the twenty four hours
begins with strong wind from S.W.
and we string S.E. by E under all sail
in place in ship's duty middle and latter
part the same so ends.

Lat by obs 40:13 S
Long by do 100:22 E

Tuesday The 13th

Begins with strong wind from W.
and we string S.E. by E under all sail
saw a bark string the same way
middle and latter part pleasant weather
and fine so ends.

Lat by obs 40:41 S
Long by do 104:00 E

Thursday The 14th

Begins with fresh wind from
N.W. and we string S.E. by E under
all sail in place in ship's duty
middle and latter part the same so ends.

Lat by obs 41:54 S
Long by do 108:53 E

Friday The 15th

Begins with fresh wind from
N.E. and thick weather in place in
ship's duty middle and latter part
stagnant weather and strong wind from
south lurch in the light sail
so ends.

Lat by obs 42:57 S
Long by do 112:05 E

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Saturday The 16th

The first part of the twenty four
hours begins with strong wind from S
and squally weather we string E.S.E.
under moderate sail at 3 P.M. double reef
fore and main top sail: at times had rain
and hail squally middle and latter part the
same at 7 P.M. lurch in the fit and main
sail so ends.

Lat by obs 43:25 S
Long by do 116:07 E

Sunday The 17th

Begins with strong wind from S and
squally weather we string E.S.E. under
double reef fore and courses and fit middle
and latter part moderate wind from N.W.
set all sail so ends.

Long by D.P. 119:30 E
Lat by obs 43:47 S

Monday The 18th

Begins with fresh wind from N.W.
and we string E by S under all sail
at 7 P.M. full the main sail and the
head sail: middle and latter part the same
so ends.

Lat by obs 44:05 S
Long by do 123:13 E

Tuesday The 19th

Begins with moderate wind from N.W.
we string E by S under all sail in place
in repairing the fit middle and latter part
the same so ends.

Lat by obs 44:17 S Long by do 126:39 E
