Thursday The 20th

The first part of these twenty four hours began with light winds from N. S. W. and we stoving E. by S under all sail in plain in repairing for top stay sail. middle and latter part the same so ends

Friday The 21st

Begain with moderate winds from N. W. and we stoving E. by S under all sail in plain in blacksmithing at 4 P.M. brought out fore water found 7 larks on port side. middle and latter part the same so ends

Long by do. 134:30 E

Saturday The 22^d

Begain with strong winds from the North and we stoving E. by S under all sail. whait and thick weather middle and latter part the same so ends

Lat by D. Re. 44:59 S
Long by do. 138:10 E

Sunday The 23^d

Begain with light and baffling winds from north and west. thick and rainy weather stoving E. by S. middle and latter part the same so ends

Lat by obs 46:05 S Long by do 141:19 E

Remarks on Board Ship Pat. Gosenold

March 24th 1864

Sunday The 24th

The first part of these twenty four hours began with light winds from S. W. and we stoving E. by S under all sail middle and latter part the same so ends

Lat by obs 46:05 S
Long by do. 144:00 E

Monday The 25th

Begain with light winds from S. W. and fine weather we stoving E. by S under all sail in plain in ship duty middle and latter part the same so ends

Lat by obs 46:03 S
Long by D. Re. 148:15 E

Tuesday The 26th

Begain with light and baffling winds from S. W. to N. W. we stoving E. by S in plain in ship duty brought fore head and m. lasses: middle and latter part the same saw plenty finibacks so ends

Lat by D. Re. 46:00 S
Long by do. 150:30 E

Wednesday The 27th

Begain with light winds from Westward and fine weather saw finibacks we stoving East by N. middle and latter light winds from N. and fine weather saw finibacks so ends

Lat by obs 45:35 S
Long by do 152:22 E
