

On New Zealand April: 1867

Thursday The 4th

The first part of these twenty four hours began with moderate winds from N.W. and Squally and thick weather we heading up N.W. & under all sail at 6 P.M. tacked in the light sails and double reef fore and main top sails: middle and latter part light wind and fine weather saw fine bark and got one porpoise Sounded

Lat by obs 44: 14 S

Long by do: 164: 36.6

Friday The 5th

Began with light wind from northern and westward we heading to the N.E. under all sail in getting about our head at 6 tacked in the light sails: middle and latter part strong wind and thick and rainy weather Sounded

Lat by obs 43: 57 S

Long by do with 165: 07.6

Saturday The 6th

Began with moderate gale from N.W. and rainy and thick weather we heading to the westward under double reef at 5 P.M. tacked in fore and main top sail and jib and main sail at 10 P.M. the wind had round to the southward we star off N.W. middle part strong gale latter part moderate: Sounded

Lat by obs 41: 50 S

Long by do 164: 25.6

April 1867

Sunday The 7th

The first part of these twenty four hours commenced with moderate gale from south and we steering N.W. & under all sail in place in ship duty: middle and latter part light and baffling wind Sounded

Lat by obs 40: 44 S

Long by D. Re.

Monday The 8th

Began with light and baffling wind from northward and westward at 6 P.M. tacked in sail middle and latter part strong wind and ruff weather weather Sounded

Lat by obs 40: 30 S

Long by D. Re.

Tuesday The 9th

Began with strong wind from N.W. we steering N.W. & under double reef and courses in place in painting boats middle and latter part strong wind from S. and Squally weather Sounded

Lat by obs 38: 48 S

Long by D. Re.

Wednesday The 10th

Began with strong wind from eastward and we steering N.W. under moderate sail at 6 P.M. tacked in sail as usual: middle and latter part strong wind and thick weather Sounded

Lat by obs 38: 00 S
