

To the S. W. of Three Kings April 1864

Thursday The 11th

The first part of this twenty four hours begins with strong wind from Eastward we heading up N. E. by E. double topsails at 3 P.M. at 6 do. tacking in courses and am fore and mizen topsails; middle part strong gail from S. E. at 11 P.M. set out reef the main top sail last part the same at 8 o'clock were round to the Southward so end

Friday The 12th

Begins with strong gail from S. E. and reef and fore sail we heading to the Southward and lost reef main top sail and fore top stay sail and blew of main Spencer middle part moderate gail and latter part strong wind and away Southward

Saturday The 13th

Begins with strong wind from Eastward and we heading up to the N. E. under double reefs and courses in plain in shipy duty middle and latter part moderate wind so end

Sunday The 14th

The first part of this twenty four hours begins with calm and baffling wind; middle and latter part strong wind from E. S. E. we heading to the Northward so end

Lat of obs 34:17 S
Long by do. 169:15 E

Monday The 15th

Begins with strong wind from E. S. E. we heading to the Northward under moderate sail at 6 P.M. Short in sail as usual middle and latter part strong wind and reef so end

Lat of obs 33:57 S
Long by do. 169:40 E

Tuesday The 16th

Begins with strong wind from N. W. E. we heading to the Eastward under moderate sail at 6 P.M. Short in sail at 8 o'clock were round to the East latter part moderate wind so end

Lat of obs 34:21 S
Long by do. 170:36 E

Wednesday The 17th

Begins with moderate wind from the Northward and Eastward we heading E. by S. at 6 P.M. Short in sail middle and latter part light wind and fine weather at 9 o'clock set a sail at 1 do. saw the three kings being N. E. E. from us so end
