Friday the 26th

There being impleid in weather and other duty making weather the latter part Sunday

Saturday the 27th

impleid in stowing down weather Sunday

Sunday the 28th

On whack on liberty, or nearly all hands

Monday the 29th

impleid in breaking out the fore hatch and on whack on liberty

Tuesday the 30th

impleid in various jobs on whack on liberty

May the First Wednesday

impleid in various jobs and whack on liberty

Thursday the 2^d

impleid in breaking out 20 bbls of oil to sail and whack on liberty

Friday the 3^d

impleid in bending stowingsails, beams on shore and whack on liberty

Saturday the 4th

impleid in preparing the main gabut sail and Boats and towing 20 bbls of oil to be sold

Remarks On Board Ship Port Gasnett

May 1867

Sunday the 5th

all hands on liberty, for the last day

Monday the 6th

On Ship duty done on board other rigging and fishing; James portugues and Byfield wither both deserted Spence to Swin - has in night

Tuesday the 7th

Fishing, and hatching, and blacksmithing

Wednesday the 8th

Had out in stream truck in on boat and put out on other James and William by file have not return yet

Thursday the 9th

impleid in giving the potatoes on Board at 6 A.M. laid anchor and set sail at 8 the Pilot left us with port light wind from S.W. James and William Byfield the deserted Seamen could not be found so we had to go with out them - Sunday

Friday the 10th

Begins with light wind from S.W. we stiring S.E. under all sail today we stave the anchor and change our cable on stordboard side we ported it on the larboard side and was in light at Sun down much and latter part strong wind from S.W. Sunday
