

Bound To The Meridian May of 1867

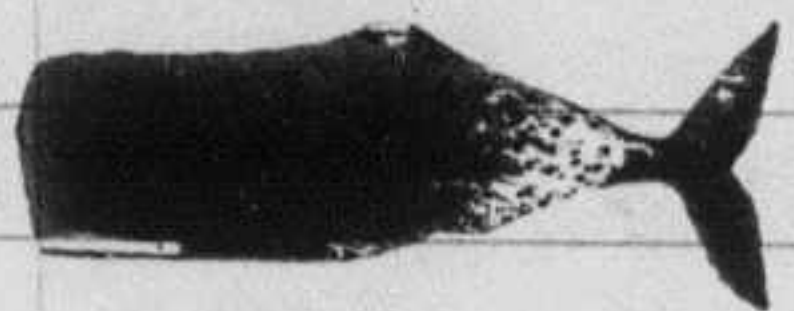
Saturday The 11th

The first part of these twenty four hours began with moderate gail from S.W. we strung E. S. E. under Short Sail impleid in repairing the fore sail at 4 P.M. we kind it and touch in the sail but lost reef main top sail and fore top stay sail and luff to the opposite middle and latter part Strong gail Saench

Long 149° 10'

Sunday The 12th

Begain with moderate gail from S and S.W. strung E. S. E. under Close reef main top sail middle and latter part moderate wind and fine fair

Long 149° 24' E

Monday The 13th

Begain with moderate wind from S. S. W. and we strung E. S. E. under Short Sail at 6 P.M. touch in sail and luff to the S. E. middle and latter part light wind, at 10 A.M. saw a school of Spalm whales, saw for them Struck one

Remarks on Board Ship For the new Gas hold

May 1867

Tuesday The 14th

Begain with light wind from Westward we begin impleid in whaling at 3 P.M. we had our whale along side and got ready and commenced cutting at 10 A.M. finished cutting So end

Wednesday The 15th



Commenced with light wind and fine weather at 1 P.M. saw a large whale saw for him Struck him but the harpoon broke so we return on board with out success latter part impleid in trying out Saench

Lat 60° 13' S
Long 149° 45' W



Thursday The 16th

Commenced with light wind from the South we impleid in trying out at noon saw a school of whales saw for them got one at 6 P.M. had him along side for board the boat capsized lost nothing at 6 A.M. commenced cutting at 10 A.M. finished latter part Calm Saench

Friday The 17th

Begain with Calm impleid in baiting middle part steady weather impleid in trying out and taking up with Caskey and other gaff So end
