

Cruise on Albatross May 1867

Sunday The 26th

The first part of this twenty four hours begins with light winds from the N. W. and rainy and thick weather we heading to the Westward middle and latter part rainy and thick weather So ends

Lat by obs 32:25 S
Long by do 177:56 E.

Monday The 27th

Begins with moderate wind from northern we heading up to N. E. under Short Sail thick squally and rainy weather: middle and latter part light wind, and fine So ends

Lat by obs
Long by do

Tuesday The 28th

Begins with light wind, and fine we heading to the Eastward in forenoon in forenoon out about our new Sail, middle and latter part moderate wind and gloomy weather So ends

Wednesday The 29th

Begins with strong wind, the Southern and we heading to the S. W. under Short Sail today we beam on fore top stay sail new one middle and latter part strong wind So ends

Lat by obs 32:14 S
Long by do 177:45 W

Notes and Remarks on Steam Ship, Rosebud May 1867

Thursday The 30th

Commence with with strong wind from Southern and we steering to the northward under Short Sail in forenoon in bending the old fore top sail and bending another old one also made a fore stay sail out of the old fore top sail. Day sail: middle and latter part moderate winds and fine weather So ends

Lat by obs 30:50 S.
Long by do 177:30

Friday The 31st

Begins with light wind from Eastward and we heading up to the northward under moderate Sail in forenoon in repairing the old main top sail and bending it on and unbending the new one and stowed it away at sundown Short in Sail as usual: at 8 A.M. saw a ship standing to the Southern latter part squally and light wind So ends

Saturday The 1st

Begins with light wind from Southern and we steering to the N. E. and moderate Sail at 5 P.M. Short in Sail as usual: at 8 A.M. saw Sundry Island bearing N. by E. from us middle and latter part light wind and fine weather So ends

Lat by obs 29:15 S
Long by do 178:49 W

Sunday The 2^d

Begins with light wind and fine weather wind from Eastward Sundry Island at sundown bore 6 from us distance 30 miles
