

Cruison On Coast June 1867

Wednesday The 17<sup>th</sup>

Begins with fresh wind from N.W. we heading to the South under moderate sail saw finback at sundown shot in sail as usual middle and latter part fresh wind and fine weather saw fine backs. So end.

Lat by alt 25:37 S  
Long by do 174:37 W

Thursday The 20<sup>th</sup>

Begins with strong breeze and fine wind from N.W. we heading to the S.W. under all sail at sundown shot in sail as usual saw fine backs middle and latter part the same. So end.

Lat by alt Lat 24:33 S  
Long by do 175:55 W

Friday The 21<sup>st</sup>

Begins with strong wind from the westward we heading to the S.W. at 6 A.M. saw the ship James Smith and Milton: James 12 months out with 1400 lbs. oil Milton 22 months out with 1400 lbs. oil all tacks latter part moderate wind. So end.

Saturday The 22<sup>nd</sup>

Begins with moderate wind from S.W. we heading to the South in company with James, S. and Milton latter part strong wind in rough weather. So end.

Lat and Remarks on Board Ship Bal. General

June 1867 Monday The 23<sup>rd</sup> Sunday

Begins with strong wind from S.E. and we heading to the S.W. under moderate sail in company with James, S. and Milton middle and latter part moderate wind. So end.

Tuesday The 24<sup>th</sup>

Commences with moderate wind and fine weather at sundown shot in sail as usual middle and latter part moderate wind and sunny weather: Milton and the Smith in sight. So end.

Lat by alt 25:12 S

Wednesday The 25<sup>th</sup>

Commences with moderate wind from E.S. and we heading S under moderate sail Milton and James, S. off our lee: middle and latter part moderate wind and fine weather. Saw finback: So end.

Lat by alt 25:42 S  
Long by do 176:27 W

Thursday The 26<sup>th</sup>

Begins with moderate wind from the E. and we steering S.S.W. under moderate sail saw a bit off lee beam at sundown shot in sail as usual middle and latter part strong wind from E. and rough weather. So end.

Lat by alt 27:25 S
