

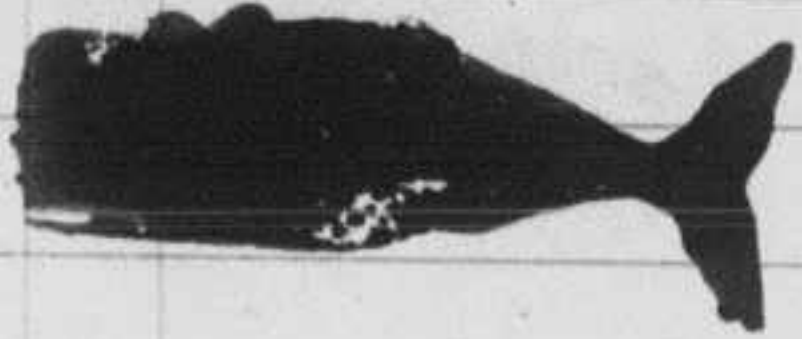
Cruise on coast June July 1867

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Friday The 6th

Began with moderate wind from Southern and Easter and squally weather implied in whaling at 3 P.M. had two whales along side: mid and latter part implied in cutting. So end with squally and ruff weather

Lat 40° 25' 58" S
Long 70° 17' 15" W



Saturday The 7th

Began with moderate wind and weather implied in cutting. Latter part implied in trying out. So end.

Lat 40° 26' 15" S
Long 70°

Sunday The 8th

Began with wind from westward and fine weather. Then day we begin in whaling at 4 P.M. saw a school of sperm whales down for them at 6. So return with out but less mid and latter part strong wind and cloudy weather. So end.

Lat 40° 25' 12" S

Monday The 9th

Began with strong wind from westward and ruff and squally weather. Then implied in trying out: mid and latter part moderate gail and ruff weather. So end.

Remarks on Board Ship Boat Gosnold 1867

Tuesday The 10th

Began with moderate gail from the Southern and heading to the westward under main spruce and for stay sail implied in trying out: mid and latter part moderate wind and fine weather. So end.

Lat 40° 25' 37" S
Long 70° 17' 40" W

Wednesday The 11th

Began with light air and fine weather. Then implied in trying out and other jobs: mid and latter part. Then the same. So end.

Thursday The 11th

Began with light wind and fine weather implied in staying down. Some the oil and finishing trying out: mid and latter part. Strong wind from Southern and ruff weather. So end.

Friday The 12th

Began with strong wind from the Southern and ruff weather and strong squally at times we heading to the westward: mid and latter part strong wind and ruff squally weather. Saw fine back. So end.

Lat 40° 25' 22" S
Long 70° 17' 21" W
