Begins with moderate gail and ruff and squally weather from S we heading to the westward Short Sail haul out for bread and flower: midle and latter part fine Saench.

Begins with moderate wind from the South and fine weather Saw pumps, these day we been impleid in obtaining our midle and latter part fine Saench.

Begins with moderate wind on fine we heading Southern and westward at 3 P.M. Saw game of seal at 4 o'clock him midle and latter part squally Saench.

Begins with boflying wind and squally weather we heading to the Eastward midle and latter part fine running to the South west Saench.

July Wednesday The 17th 1867

The first part of this twenty four hours begins with light wind from E. S. E. and we string to the Southwest impleid in blacksmithing and then duthy at sundown Short in Sail and huff to the North at 2 o'clock Str. off S. W. and moderate Sail midle and latter part fine Saench.

Long by do 176:55 W

Thursday The 18th

Begins with moderate wind from E. S. E. and we string to the S. W. impleid in blacksmithing and then duthy at 3 P. M. James Gosnell saw a sperm whale and set the Carls for us he saw his boat at 4 o'clock we haul our boats down and went down and meted with them and the net struck the whale but he got stove and lost the whale with line fast to it at 6 we return on board were round to the North at 4 o'clock and round to the westward at 8 Str. off to the Southern westward midle and latter part fine Saench.

Friday The 19th

Begins with moderate wind from the North and we running to the South and westward under all sail impleid in blacksmithing game of seal was in sight Captain dealt out shoes and clothing to the crew today at sundown we round to N. E. at 2 o'clock we Str. to the South and westward.
