Friday The 19th

16 At 7 AM we saw Spalm whale at 10 do we layed for them at 11 do Struck one and kill him middle and latter part Squally and rainy weather so end

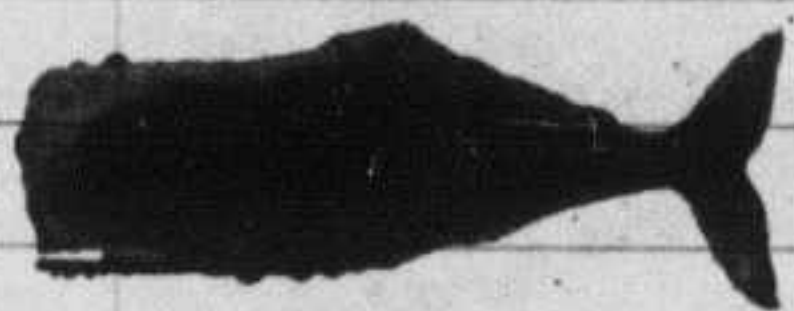


Saturday The 20th

17 Begain with moderate wind, and Squally weather at 7 AM we kill the whale a long side at 3 PM commence cutting. at 10 AM we saw whale and laid for them: at 11 do Struck one but the pot at noon Still Chasing, so end with fine weather Chasing the whale so end

Sunday The 21st

Begain with light wind, and fine weather implaining Chasing whale at 1 PM. Struck the same whale that we had struck. At 2 do succeed in killing him at 7 PM kill him a long side latter part implain in finished cutting the other whale latter part fine weather so end

Monday The 22^d

Begain with light baffling wind, and fine weather implain in chasing up deck latter implain in cutting the last whale wish it was started very much so end

Jackson cut his foot there fore he is off duty

Tuesday The 23^d

Begain with moderate wind, and fine weather we bein implain in trying out and cutting up lumber and other duty middle and latter part the same

Wednesday The 24th

Begain with moderate wind and fine weather we bein implain in trying out and other duty middle and latter part moderate wind and gloom weather so end

Lat 46° 26' N

Thursday The 25th

Begain with strong wind, from north west and latter part rainy and squally weather Spanish Sparrow hawk and ashore static Calam at 7 PM we start again at 7 AM so end

Friday The 26th

Begain with moderate wind from NW we bein implain in bailing: middle and latter part fine saw a brown balch off our lee so end

Lat 46°
Long 178°

Saturday The 27th

Begain with light air, and fine weather wind from NW these day bein with boiling middle and latter part Calam and fine weather so end

Lat 46° 33' Long 178° 25' W
