

Crusan on Vasquez July 1867

Sunday The 20th

The first part of these twenty four hours begins with calm and fine weather then we begin in light in trying out and blowing down at 7 P.M. finished sailing middle and latter part light wind from Westward we runing to the Eastward so ends

Lat 40° 26:30 S
Long 118:59 W

Monday The 21st

Begain with light wind from Westward and we runing to Eastward under all sail at sundown we shot in sail: middle and latter part fine

Lat 40° 26:02 S
Long 118:47 W

Tuesday The 30th

Begain with light wind, and fine we runing to the Eastward under moderate sail in light in Coopering and other jobs Spaulk. From backer oil is before reported latter part we begin in light in blowing down and latter part fine so ends

Lat 40° 26:00 S

Wednesday The 31st

Begain with moderate wind, and squally weather wind from north we runing to the Southward and East in light in blowing down: middle and latter part strong wind and rainy weather so ends: fully

August of 1867

Thursday The 1st

The first part of these twenty four hours begins strong wind from N.W. and suff. and rain weather we heading to the north under short sail middle and latter part the same so ends

Friday The 2nd

Begain with strong wind from N.W. and we heading to the S.W. under short sail in light in repairing, Cores, Saw fine back, middle and latter part fine so ends

Lat 40° 26:43 S
Long 118:32 W

Saturday The 3rd

Commencing with moderate wind from N.W. we heading to the S.W. under moderate sail in light in repairing Cores, Saw fine back, back out for meat and molasses middle and latter part fine so ends

Lat 40° 27:25 S
Long 118:53 W

Sunday The 4th

Begain with light wind, from N.W. and we heading to the North under moderate sail. Saw fine back, and at sundown shot in sail & usual at 6 A.M. made all sail and shot by N. middle and latter part light wind from Westward and fine weather Saw fine back, so ends

Lat 40° 26:37 S
Long 118:34 W
