Tuesday The 20th

Begins with strong wind, these days we been
employed in various jobs: latter part employed in
coppering the ground on main deck so end

Wednesday The 21st

These days we been employed in coppering
it: latter part the same

Thursday The 22^d

Employed in coppering and tacking

Friday The 23^d

Employed in coppering the ground in
fore hatch

Saturday The 24th

Employed in coppering in fore hatch and
tacking today we finished coppering

Sunday The 25th

Resting day

Monday The 26th

Getting water and greasing out
after hatch and other jobs

Tuesday The 27th

Employed in getting water off and wood
and staining it away

Wednesday The 28th

employed in watering and wooding
and tacking fore masts

Remarks On Board Ship Bart. Gosnold 1861

Thursday The 27th

These days we been employed in getting water
and staining it away and wood we taking
300 lbs of water and 10 bags laid of wood
and finished staining off main and fore
decks

Friday The 30th

Employed in various jobs repairing mizen
gabarit sail and oiling the lower masts and
painting

Saturday The 31st

Employed in various jobs and getting ready
fore sea. Captain Ship three natives: Withm: Robert
and James

Sunday The 1st

Employed in coppering with Abraham back
and James Anote head wind can't get
out

Monday The 2^d

Employed in getting Abraham back and James
Anote on us under away which we
succeed latter part light breeze and fine
beating out through the reefs Saene

Tuesday The 3^d

Beating out from Cantara harbor bound
to bucaliver bay after rigging and gear away
at 7 P.M. we got back off point of land
heading off shore toward 15 miles off James
Anote and Abraham back off beach near 2
miles off wind from S.W. at 9 A.M. Capt.
went on shore trading at noon return
with very little success Saene
