Further part rain stop and thick weather
Strong N. N. E. Saund

Lat 6. D. 26: 10 S.
Long by do 178: 25 West

Thursday The 12th

Begins with light wind, from N. and
thick and rainy weather. Saw porpoises
at 6 P.M. Shot in sail: mile and
better part moderate wind Saund

Lat by 26: 16 S
Long by do 176 46 West

Friday The 13th

Begins with light wind, from north
we heading to the Southern end Eastward
mile and better part calm and fine
Saund

Lat by 25: 57 S

Saturday The 14th

Commenced with calm and fine these
day we begin in making out for
hairs and after half fore water prisoners and
to ragulate other things: mid and better
part strong and rainy weather
Saund

Remarks on Board Ship Bart. Gasnolet

September 1867

Sunday The 15th

21 The first part of these twenty four hours
begin with strong wind from N. W. and
rainy weather at 2 P.M. Saw a bristly
to wind of us at 5:00 saw Spots, Spause to
be sent back at Sundown shot in sail
mile and better part light wind and thick
and hazy weather so end

Lat by 26: 17 S
Long by do 174: 31 W

Monday The 16th

22 Begins with light wind and hazy weather
at 4 P.M. Saw Spauls whale heading to
the S.E. we hauled for them but at Sundown
return with out success: at 6 P.M. saw them
again hauled for them but return at noon
with out success so end

Lat by 26: 20 S
Long by do 174: 31 W

Tuesday The 17th

Begins with light air and calm, at 5
P.M. saw whale, hauled for them both one
but the iron came out at Sundown we
return with out success: mid and
better part strong wind and ruff
weather so end

Lat by 26: 34 S
Long by do 173: 37 W
