Wednesday The 18th

The first part of these twenty four hours
commenced with moderate wind from the
south we heading to the west and short
23. sail in place in getting up the rigging and other
jobs at 6 o'clock saw Spatna who had
gone there at noon return with out success
So ends

Thursday The 19th

Begins with light air and calm
at 2 P.M. saw Spatna who had
them struck one and got him at 6 o'clock
had him along side at 6 o'clock commenced
cutting latter part squally weather
So ends

Engaged in cutting at 6 P.M. finished
cutting at 6 o'clock. Stood the fire midline
latter part strong breeze and fine so ends

Begins with moderate wind and fine
this day we begin in place in trying out
middle and latter part strong wind from the
west so ends

The first part of these twenty four hours begin
with moderate wind and pleasant weather wind
from the west we begin in place in trying out
middle and latter part calm and fine so ends

Monday The 23rd

Commenced with calm and fine weather
begin in place in trying out and breaking out the
main haly for cork and changing weather
middle and latter part calm and fine weather so ends

Tuesday The 24th

Begins with light air and fine weather at 3 P.M.
finished painting which turn out about one hundred
of 100 middle and latter part squally in place
in standing starboard of after haly ground beam
so ends

Wednesday The 25th

Begins with moderate wind from S.E. we
heading to the south and under short sail
in place in standing starboard side of after
haly ground beam middle and latter part
fine so ends
