Sunday The 13th

The first part of this twenty four hours begins with strong wind from Westward we heading to the northwest: middle and latter part light air and fine weather Sound

Lat 40° 30'
Long 124° 00'

Monday The 14th

Beginning with light air and calm, saw two sailing bark on ship: middle and latter part strong wind and rough weather Sound

Tuesday The 15th

Beginning with strong wind from Southward we heading to the Southward and Eastward in company with Milton middle and latter part the same Sound

Lat 40° 58' S
Long 124° 05' W

Wednesday The 16th

Beginning with strong wind from the Southward we heading to the Eastward in company with Milton at 10 o'clock that in P.M. middle and latter part light wind and fine weather Sound

Lat 40° 21' S
Long 123° 10' W

Thursday The 17th

The first part of this twenty four hours begins with light wind from Southward we heading to the Eastward in P.M. in various jobs: middle and latter part calm and fine Sound

Friday The 18th

Commencing with calm and baffling wind, these day we put out the starboard boat and touch in the spair one: middle and latter part calm and fine weather Sound

Lat 40° 27' S
Long 122° 00'

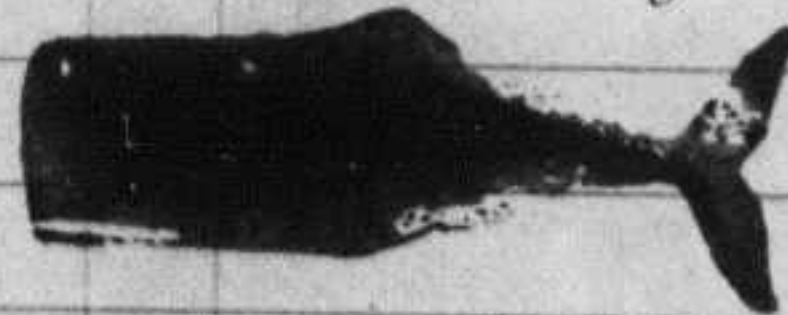
Saturday The 19th

Beginning with calm, and fine brought out fore mast flower and water: middle and latter part calm and light air Sound

Lat 40° 36'

Sunday The 20th

Beginning with light air from Eastward we starting to the S.W. at 6 P.M. shot in 25 Salt: at 6 P.M. saw a school of Spout whales and for them struck 3 more out to get them together by passing the boat stern Sound
