Wednesday The 6th

The first of these twenty four hours begins with fresh wind from S.E. we heading up S.E. under moderate sail in place in ships duty: middle and latter part thick and rainy weather so end

Thursday The 7th

Begins with strong wind from N.W. & we heading to the S.W. under short sail middle and latter part moderate gale so end

Lat both 28:00 S

Friday The 8th

Begins with strong gale from West and we heading to the southward under short reef main top sail and fore top sail and main spraker: middle and latter part strong wind from S.W. so end

Lat both 28:00 S
Long by do 174:50 W

Saturday The 9th

Begins with strong wind from S.W. and ruff weather we steering S.E. & under short sail in place in ships duty middle and latter part moderate wind and fine weather so end

Lat both 26:50 S
Long by do 175:10 W

November 1868 Sunday The 10th

The first part part of these twenty four hours commencing with moderate wind and fine weather wind from S.E. we heading to the S.W. under all sail and at sundown short in sail as usual: middle and latter part the same so end

Lat both 28:25 S
Long by do 176:08 W

Monday The 11th

Begins with light air S.E. we heading to southward few gusts: middle and latter part light wind and fine weather so end

Lat both 29:50 S

Tuesday The 12th

Begins with light wind from E.S.E. and fine weather we going to the southward in place in setting up the head rigging and salt sters at 6 o'clock saw Sunday Island middle and latter part fine so end

Lat both 29:02 S
Long by do 177:27 W

Wednesday The 13th

Begins with light wind from E.S.E. we steering S.S.E. under all sail in place in ships duty at sundown short in sail as usual Sunday Island saw S.W. from us 15 miles off: at sundown Sunday Island over off lee quarter middle and latter part fine so end

Lat both 30:11 S
Long by do 177:30 W
