Thursday The 14th

The first part of this twenty four hours began with moderate wind from eastward and strong S by E under all sail implied in ships duty middle and latter part light wind and hazy weather So end.

Friday The 15th

Begins with strong wind from E we strong S by E under all sail at 5 o'clock shot in sail at 7 o'clock took all sail in but double reef main top sail and fore top stay sail very thick and rainy middle and latter part moderate gail at 1 o'clock took in the main top sail So end.

Lat by alt 33:11 S
Long by do 177:12 W

Saturday The 16th

Begins with moderate gail from S. E. we heading to the westward under close reef main top sail and fore sail middle and latter part moderate wind and fine So end.

Lat by alt 32:52 S
Long by do 177:41 East

Sunday The 17th

Begins with calm and fine middle part rainy latter part light wind from the southward and fine weather So end.

Lat by alt 33:05 S
Long by D. Re. 177:30 E

Monday The 18th

The first part of this twenty four hours began with moderate wind from E. S. E. we heading to the southward and under moderate sail at sun down shot in sail as usual middle and latter part light wind and fine So end.

Lat by alt 33:35 S
Long by do 177:12 E

Tuesday The 19th

Begins with moderate wind from the northward we strong S moderate sail implied in various jobs at sun down shot in sail as usual middle and latter part moderate gail from westward So end.

Lat by alt 35:09 S

Wednesday The 20th

Begins with strong gail from westward and rough weather with strong squalls at times middle and latter part the same So end.

Lat by alt 35:39 S

Thursday The 21st

Begins with strong gail from westward we heading to the northward and close reef main top sail saw a sail strong to the eastward middle and latter part strong wind and rough weather So end.

Lat by alt 35:08 S
Long by do 177:30 East
