Tuesday The 26th

Begin with moderate wind from Eastward
we heading to the northward all sail in use
in ship's duty. Saw a bit of milk and latter
part fine sand.

Lat 40° 34' 03" S

Wednesday The 27th

Begin with light wind from Eastward
branch of barometer 19.1 months out
15.00 lbs milk and latter part
hazy weather and ruff sand.

Lat 40° 34' 09" S

Long 178° 13' E

Thursday The 30th

Begin with strong easterly wind and
squally and ruff weather. Saw ch. Bark
and Re: Tunny milk and latter part
the same sand.

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Lat 40° 33' 24" S

Friday The 31st

Begin with easterly wind and
ruff weather. Li. Bark. Saw whale
got 2 after that we heard our boat
at 6 P.M. return with out success
milk and latter part strong easterly
wind and thick and squally weather.
Saw one bit sand.

Remarks On Bartholomew Gosnell 1868

February The First

Sunday

The first part part of these twenty faves
begin with strong easterly wind and ruff
and squally weather we heading to the southward
at 7 P.M. and move to the North at 7. All
was round again to the Southward milk and
latter part blow up a moderate gail sand.

Sunday The 2nd

Begin with strong easterly gail
and ruff weather. Laying under close reef
main top sail and foot of main spencer
one fore top stay sail milk and latter part
strong gail and heavy sea sand.

Lat 40° 34' 15" S

Monday The 3rd

Begin with strong gail from N.W.
with heavy sea and rainy weather at 10
at 7 P.M. tack in all sail but double reef
main top sail and top stay sail latter part
the same

Lat 40° 34' 50" S

Long 178° 21' E

Tuesday The 4th

Begin with strong gail from N.W. we
we heading the N.W. at 6 P.M. tack
in the main top sail milk part moderate
some: latter part heavy and thick sand
