Wednesday the 12th

Begins with strong easterly winds and fine weather in Chalen wharf at sundown struck one and got him latter part full him in to end.

Begins with strong winds from the Eastward we heading to the Southward in sailing middle and latter part strong winds and ruff weather. Saw the Robert Savers sailing South.

Friday the 13th

Begins with strong easterly winds and ruff weather we heading to the N.E. under short sail in place in sailing middle and latter part moderate gail from Eastward and ruff weather South.

Lat by Ab 33:58 S

Long by do 177:05 East

Saturday the 14th

Begins with strong gail from Eastward we heading to the N.E. at 4 P.M. struck in the main top sail at 5 do finished sailing. whole turn out 55-100: middle and latter part strong gail and heavy sea on South.

Sunday the 15th

The first part of these twenty four hours begins with strong northerly wind and ruff weather we heading to the Eastward middle and latter part light winds from the north and Eastward South.

Begins with light air from the north and dry weather we heading to the Eastward under all sail at sundown short in sail as usual in the part sailing latter part strong wind from E.S.E. and squally weather South.

Tuesday the 18th

Begins with strong E.S.E. wind and ruff weather we heading to the northward under double reef main top sail at sundown short reef it middle and latter strong and ruff weather South.

Wednesday the 19th

Begins with strong easterly wind and ruff we heading to the N.E. under short sail in place in standing cannot set at sundown touch. Star board the boat to repair and set out the spair one: middle and latter part fine South.
