Brisk gales from the E & SE by to the NE
at eight took the fore topsail in middle rain
Last part strong gale from the E at daylight
took the fore sail in and set the boat on the
upper craning thick and rainy So Ends

Long 174.41

Strong gale from the E thick and rainy
weather at 4 P.M. closed reef the main
Top sail by to the S.W. wind from S.E.
middle the fore to the S.W. at daylight
Made sail at daylight Steered E by S made sail as required
Employed in Sunday day So Ends

Wednesday the 31st

Long 176.20

Commence with moderate wind from the
W.W. Steering E.W. at eight took the
light sail in middle and last part went
made all sail at daylight Steered E by S Employed
in Sunday day about the rigging and blacksmithing

Thursday the 1st

Brisk wind from the W Steering
E by W all sail out Employed in Sunday
day and blacksmithing at eight took
the light sail in and Steered E by S middle
and last part heavy weather wind from
W.W. Employed in repairing Gas by starting
Water and Sunday after day So Ends

Lat 33.14

Long 177.47

Brisk wind from W.W. Steering E by S by 11
sail middle last part fine wind from W by to E
at daylight set a Wharfe by to the W. at 6 P.M. Made all sail out

Friday the 3rd

Lat 32.56

Long 174.54

Commence with Brisk wind Pleasant
Weather S.E. at eight shortened sail and reefed by to
the E & S from W middle and last part Pleasant
with a breeze by W. All sail at the New Beach to
the W.W. late up for it caught in a net
up Oil Whack So Ends

Saturday the 4th

Lat 34.54

Long 175.50

Commence with moderate wind from W.W.
by to the W. all sail out at the New Beach
Whole going quick to a large body of them at
1 P.M. shortened sail and put to windward
at chase till dark could not get half whole
they and going quick took the Boat up after dark
middle and last part light air by to W by W all
sail out Employed in setting up Oil Whack

Sunday the 5th

Lat 35.50

Light air and calm Employed in Sunday
day middle and last part light wind from the
S.W. by to the E. Up the Ship E. S. S. S. S.
22. month out 1200 lbs of sperm Oil fine weather
So Ends

Monday the 6th

Lat 36.54

Long 177.54

Moderate wind from the S.W. by to the E & S
all sail out 2 P.M. a fresh calkies at eight
shortened sail and reefed by to the W.W.
middle part wind by to the South at 6 P.M.
Tied the ship to the W.W. Employed in repairing and
setting up Wharfe by the E. S. S. S. S. S. S. S.

Tuesday the 7th

Lat 37.54

Long 178.58

Light wind from W by to the W.W. all sail out at eight
shortened sail middle wind by to E & S last part 6 P.M. Steered W
by W Employed in setting up Whack sail in light to the S.W.
