chase saw a sail at 11 am. so End.

Feb the 14th

120 The 14
BrisK Windy from the N^E the Boat in-
chase of the Whale the Station Light-
boat 25-00 and went to water in chase of the Whale
at 6 P.M. took the Boat up at 10 and set the
whal out of sight to the ENE used Abip tott.
At dark Capt Baker came on board but
got any oil since we saw him at 10 he
went ship to the N^E the wind blew to the ESE
carried sail by mark up to the Whale at 7 P.M.
Saw the Whale right ahead 8th Gunner
4 Boat bore him in. Saltyer app the
Sun Burn 10 mls at 11th struck the whale
he spawed out 850 fathom of line on shing
and after Boat struck and he took the 4. Line was empty

Feb the 17th

Light air and calm. Employed in boiling
fat off boat. At 4 P.M. saw something we supposed to be
a dead whale. Lower a boat and went to it and
found it to be our old caribou. Middle and last
part calm. No E. wind strong inside till 5 P.M.

Worm the 15th

Cal mth weather Employed in hauling
Lat 24.40 midnec and last part light. Sixty persons
Long 115.11.6. E by E to the W by E at 4.4. M finished
Sailing at day light - made all sail

March the 19th

Lightning from the E by to the S at 11 AM
 Feb 25 09. Rave a Beach and White Water to the NW
 dist - 8 or 8 miles at right. Hartland
 Rail made and least port kept today
 Employed in Stowing Oil in the main
 Watch the Engine heading to the E
 Lightning from the North
