

Whip B. Gosnell Cruising on Tasques

July 1894

Monday the 19th

Came up with Mardret Gale from the W by to the N.W. Employed in binding foot 2425 fore and main top sail and a few spare top. Long 172.05. Mast set stay sail at right pleasant under double reef middle and least part. Light wind from the E by to the S.E. Employed in repairing the main top sail nothing left but rags of the fore top sail the stay sail entirely gone. Van Pin backs do end.

Tuesday the 20th

Strong wind from the E by to the S.E. Employed in repairing sail at right. Tied ship to the W. Middle and least part brisk wind.

Wednesday the 21st

Brisk wind from the E by to the S.E. Employed in sail mending. Van Pin Backs middle and least part brisk wind do end.

Thursday the 22nd

Strong wind from the E by to the S.E. finished and bent the main top sail and fore ship to the S.W. Middle and least part strong wind made sail as required at 12 M. Tied to the E wind from S.E. saw Van Pin Backs Cooper employed in repairing old pipe.

Friday the 23rd

Strong wind from the S.E. by to the E. under short sail employed in ship's duty. Middle and least part equally with same made and took in sail as required.

Saturday the 24th

Strong wind from the S.W. by to the S.E. equally with rain at 8 P.M. the wind veered to the W kept off S.E. middle and least part pleasant wind from the W at 6 A.M. steered E by S. Van Pin Backs the watch drawing yarns.

Sunday the 25th

Brisk wind from the W steering E by S. Employed in making spinnaker and drawing yarn at right. Tied ship to the W. Middle and least part brisk wind by to the S.W. wind from W.W.W.

Monday the 26th

Brisk wind from the W.W.W. at 12 M. Tied to the W at right. Shortened sail middle and least part brisk wind at 6 A.M. Tied ship to the W by S. wind from W.W. Employed in making spinnaker and drawing yarn.

Tuesday the 27th

Brisk wind from the S.W. by to the S.W. Employed in painting spare sail and making spinnaker. Middle and least part pleasant wind veered to the W.W. Cooper employed in repairing old pipe do end.
