Wed the 14th

Commenced with light wind from the E steering N by E all day and at night - Dist 18 miles the Maury and Albion in sight steering to the N by E had frequent squalls of rain middle the wind variable rainy - East part more Pleasant brisk wind from the N by E steering west 8 miles - No End

Thurs the 15th

Brisk wind from the N by E steering N by W the Albion and Maury in sight steering the same course at night - Dist 11 by 1 at daylight steered S by E - No End

Thurs the 16th

Strong wind from the N by E steering S by W at daylight steered S by W at 3 miles about at 5 steered N by W at 6 miles saw Randaue Island bearing N by W dist 25 miles at noon running in for the reef - No End

Fri the 17th

at 1 P.M. came to and anchored in 12 fathoms of water in barbed harbor in company with the Maury and Albion middle and East part Pleasant Employed in stowing the ground beer in the After Hold

Wed the 18th

Brisk wind Employed in killing salt water and setting up shacks for water middle and East part Pleasant Employed in draining and stowing up the Hake as usual in sight -

Thurs the 19th

Brisk Wind Employed in stowing off the hake and draining down mid and East part Pleasant at 9 A.M. the St. Barker came to anchor she has 28 hundred

Fri the 20th

Brisk wind Employed in draining and filling water

Sat the 21st

Strong southerly wind and rainy thought not Employed in draining and filling water

Sund the 22nd

Strong wind and rainy first part Employed in filling and stowing water East part more Pleasant -

Mon the 23rd

Strong N.E. wind middle and East part the same Employed in stowing water - No End

Tues the 24th

Strong Wind and Squally Employed in getting off water and draining for security before the same - No End
