S.W. saw Grampus So Ends

all sail out at 12 P.M. saw the Backer hounding
Long 171.03 E kept off at 5 P.M. saw her take a Whale along side
if the ship could of sailed as fast as a Tug

at 20 minutes to 6 P.M. saw the Whale gang quick
to windward hauled for them saw them rise in up
by dark at 8 P.M. came aboard the Back a quadruped
