Jan/70 Sat January the first/70

Canoe music is with strong wind
Lat 33.08 from the 15.15 E to the E under double
reefs the A Barks in sight Middle main-
-ing laid under double reef main top wire and fore
Sail least part the wind veered to the 15.15 then
and met So Wind strong current to the 15.15

Seen the 2nd

Thick wet weather at 8 PM the wind
Died 55.09 veered to the WNW blowing strong and
Heavy 177.02 Raining hard steered S by E at 8 PM
The Boat on the upper crany back in
all sail but fore top mast stayed in and
Main open cle hauled by to the W Middle mast
maddet set cloast reefed Main top sail at
daylight - more Pleasant kept app 15° by 15 miles
sail as required the 1st Bar her in sight

Hand the 5th

Theng arrived from the W^m Steereing
Sept 26 1866 R^e by K saw a Reach ran up to the
Kang 187 36 E ground and dug a back but saw nothing
more of it Middle and West part. Morbet-
ting stering R^e broke the Bragg Witte
of Auckland & dug out haunts to the Penger;
So Enry

Tues the 4th

Hard set Windy from the WNW shewing
 Oct 22 18 15-8 the Barker and the Blizz in sight
 Heavy 179.21 Spoke the Barker at right angles
 and best part pleasant Empegar
 in fitting 6th Stij and Secondary other
 July 20 1895 in light weather looking so striking

for Sperm Whales, Chatterbox, and other

Van Ho

Wed the 4th

Jan 11th 1855
Mild but windy from the N. W. W. Shuring
K. C. by C. and C. R. E. saw parts of a whale
carried Middle and East part Pleasant
employed in scraping window blinds and
varnishing them and bundling the Sals

Thurs the 6th

Right wind from the W steering
Oct 31. 1872
Nov 1. 1872
O.R.C. Employed in sundry duty about
the ship saw Grampuses the Barker
in sight to the S.W. Middle and East
part Light-House So Ends

Left this from the H. Whiting
Oct 31. 27 E. & C. saw Pigeons and Grampse birds
179.50 E and Coast past Light Hills Spoke the St.
Barker Steered E by S. No. End

Oct 11th

Murderet King from the W^d W^d Shering
to by S^t Middle and East part & Pleasure
at 9 A M Day French Black Larking
to S^e the Watch Employed in Ships Duty

June the 9th

82 Bright-Ship from the W running in
tearing the Rock at 4 PM it fell away calm
strong current setting to the E Ship drift-
ing in to the Rock just at 8 PM just 4
Boats ahead and towed past the Rock middle
and last past - calm saw a Hergue to the
S at 10 saw a Bright-Ship from the E at 11
saw 2 sperm Whales to the E going N.W. 1/2 S.
Downed Boat in pursuit 40 E only
