Remarks Wednesday March 3 1847
These twenty four hours fresh breeze from the NW
by N & under short sail
Lat in 12.44
Long 176.15

Remarks Wednesday March 4
First part fresh breeze from the NW & NWW equally
at 10 PM very heavy squall took in all sail at 6 AM
more moderate made sail latter part under double
reef top sails had several times strong current from
the westward at 7 AM saw a barge heaving to the North
Lat in 9.40
Long 177.10 E

Remarks Thurs March 4
First part light breeze from the NW steering by NE
at 4 PM saw Rotumah bearing NE 25 miles distant
Middle part wind NW by West latter part by NE
Lat in 12.36
Long 176.25 E

Remarks Thursday March 10
These twenty four hours heavy gale from NW
to West under double & cloth reef top sails with
very squally with heavy rain at 9 AM gave up
hope that the wind would drop made off to go
to the East of Ellice group
Lat in 9.58
B^o 29.65 W Long 177.25 E

Remarks Friday March 5
These twenty four hours light breeze from the
North and calm at 6 AM Rotumah bore ESE 30 miles
Lat in 12.33
Long 177.00 E

Remarks Friday March 12
These twenty four hours gale from the West & NW
with heavy laden steering from NE by E
Lat in 11.20
B^o 29.00 W Long 177.40 E

Remarks Saturday March 6
These twenty four hours light breeze from the
West to NW by North by West clear pleasant weather
Lat in 11.27
Long 176.30 E

Remarks Saturday March 13
First part gale from the NW and rainy steering ENE
at 6 haled to by the wind North at 9 AM more N by E
more to the NE latter part heavy gale from the NW with
heavy rains by NE under double reef top sails & courses
Lat in 11.10
B^o 29.55 W Long 177.06 E

Remarks Sunday March 7
These twenty four hours light breeze from
the NW clear pleasant weather steering by North
Lat in 9.47
Long 177.18 E

Remarks Sunday March 14
These twenty four hours strong gale from the NW
equally with nearly constant rain by NE by NW under
cloth reef top sails
Lat in 10.40
B^o 29.40 W Long 177.00 E

Remarks Monday March 8
First part fresh breeze from the NW by NE at 2 PM
hailed to the NW at 5 PM equally double reef the
top sails Middle and latter part fresh gales and
equally with rain NW flying to the West Lat in 9.45
B^o 29.71 Long 177.00 E

Remarks Monday March 15
These twenty four hours fresh gale from the NW
and cloudy with some rain steering by NW by N
under cloth reef & double reef top sails & courses Lat in 10.10
Long 176.45 W

Remarks Tuesday March 9
These twenty four hours fresh gale from the NW
thick rainy weather equally under double reef top sails
Lat in 10.20
Long 177.05 E
