Remarks Saturday July 10

These twenty four hours light airs from the Eastward and foggy
Lat $48^{\circ} 20' N$
Long $161^{\circ} 20' E$

Remarks Sunday July 11

First part light airs and calm with fog
Middle and latter part so saw finback whale
Lat $48^{\circ} 15' N$
Long $161^{\circ} 15' E$

Remarks Monday July 12

Light airs from the Westward and foggy at 6 PM the fog lighted up about 10 PM saw 2 ships and several finbacks Middle part foggy
Latter part light breezes from the West and cloudy steering several courses saw a great number finbacks saw a ship Lat $48^{\circ} 02' N$
Long $161^{\circ} 30' E$

Remarks Tuesday July 13

These twenty four hours light airs and variable with fog steering NE saw a great number finbacks
Lat $48^{\circ} 28' N$
Long $162^{\circ} 10' E$

Remarks Wednesday July 14

Light airs from the Westward to calm and foggy at 1 PM saw a whale close to the ship, lowered one boat to foggy to pursue him. Latter part fresh breezes from the North and cloudy steering by NE at 9 AM saw a dead whale too old to cut out out an Jan marked whale
Lat $49^{\circ} 44' N$
Long $163^{\circ} 30' E$

Remarks Thursday July 15

Fresh breezes from the West and cloudy by 1 PM saw a number of finbacks Middle and latter part fresh breezes from the NW steering by NW
Lat $48^{\circ} 00' N$
Long $161^{\circ} 20' E$

Remarks Friday July 16

Light breezes and clear at 7 PM saw a whale beside him could not get on it being too late saw a ship took a whale Latter part Moderate saw a whale struck him and got a boat stove bad. The boat fast to the whale
Lat $48^{\circ} 40' N$
Long $161^{\circ} 25' E$

Remarks Saturday July 17

Moderate the bath fast to the whale at 5 PM saw the Jan at 8 AM saw whale at 10 PM struck one Latter part pleasant the bath fast to the whale saw 2 dashes and a ship spoke the back of a ship of 12 months out
Lat $48^{\circ} 30' N$
Long $161^{\circ} 10' E$

Remarks Sunday July 18

These twenty four hours light breezes from the Westward and pleasant at 2 PM the whale turned up at 3 PM took him to the ship and commenced cutting
Lat $48^{\circ} 04' N$
Long $161^{\circ} 50' E$

Remarks Monday July 19

These twenty four hours light breezes from the Westward and cloudy sailing
Lat $48^{\circ} 10' N$
Long $162^{\circ} 00' E$

Remarks Tuesday July 20

Light breezes and pleasant sailing Middle and latter part light breezes from the West and pleasant saw a great number finbacks
Lat $48^{\circ} 00' N$
Long $161^{\circ} 30' E$

Remarks Wednesday July 21

Light breezes from the North and cloudy steering NW Middle and latter part to calm
Lat $48^{\circ} 00' N$
Long $162^{\circ} 00' E$
