Friday Nov 15. 1867

First part of these 24 hours
commences with moderate winds
and cloudy weather from N.E.
at 10 a.m. sent up fore top gallant
yard so ends this day.

Saturday Nov 16. 1867

First part of these 24 hours
light winds from N.E.
latter part lite winds and clear
weather from Eastward so on

Sunday Nov 17. 1867

First part of these 24 hours
moderate wind and clear
weather from Eastward at 3 p.m.
made anchor and sailed from
N.Yal. latter part fine weather

Monday Nov 18. 1867

First part of these 24 hours
commences with lite airs and
clear weather from Eastward
going of Pickle sent boat shore
and brought of 2 men latter part
fresh breezes and clear weather
from Eastward Employed ship

Tuesday Nov 19. 1867

First part of these 24 hours
commences with lite wind and
clear weather Eastward latter
part strong winds and squally
reef fore top sail and took in
Main sail so ends Sat 37. 12

Wednesday Nov 20. 1867

First part of these 24 hours
commences with strong winds
and heavy seas from N.E. &
latter part the same at day lite sighted
St Mary Island so ends this day

Thursday Nov 21. 1867

First part of these 24 hours
commences with strong winds and
cloudy weather from N.E.
heading E under short sail
latter part strong winds and rainy
so ends this day

Friday Nov 22. 1867

First part of these 24 hours
commences with strong winds and
cloudy from N.E. & W. heading
N.E. at 2 p.m. took in fore top sail
latter part fresh gale and cloudy from
N.E. & W. heading by the wind. N.E.
so ends

Saturday Nov 23. 1867

First part of these 24 hours
commences with strong winds and
heavy seas from the North
steering S.E. with single reef fore top sail
latter part lite winds and rainy from
the north under short sail so ends

Sunday Nov 24. 1867

First part of these 24 hours lite
winds and foggy latter part fine weather
from Westward steering course S.E. by E
saw one sail with no fore top mast
Sat 35. 00 Long 20. 45 W
