E by S steering S E by S. at 4
P M shortin sail latter part
Moderate winds at day lit sighted
Canary Islands so ends this day

Friday Dec 6. 1867

First part of these 24 hours lit
wind from Eastward running
Down by Canary Islands at sun
down shortin sails latter part
the same the watch employed
Baking out for bread and flour
at 11. A M. got a porpoise Lat 28.10
Long 13.55

Saturday Dec 7. 1867

First part of these 24 hours
Light winds and clear weather
from Eastward steering W. latter
part the same the watch employed
repairing sails so ends heat 27.51

Sunday Dec 8. 1867

Black fish First part of these 24 hours
Commences with lite winds and
cloudy weather from Eastward
at 3 P M rose black fish lowered
for them black fish being shy
could not strike latter part
the same so ends no obs

Monday Dec 9. 1867

First part of these 24 hours
Commence with lite winds and
cloudy weather from N W latter
part strong winds and cloudy from
the north so ends Lat 28.00-13.38

Tuesday Dec 10. 1867

First part of these 24 hours
strong winds and cloudy weather
from the north the watch
employed repairing sails at sun
down shortin sails latter part strong
winds and heavy seas watch employed
ships duty so ends

Wednesday Dec 11. 1867

First part of these 24 hours
Commences with fresh breezes
and rainy from the north
At 5 P M. steered W by N
latter part calm the watch employed
ships duty so ends this day

Thursday Dec 12. 1867

First part of these 24 hours
Commences with calm and rainy
weather from the Eastward latter
part strong winds and clear weather
from S W heading to westward so
ends this day Lat Long

Friday Dec 13. 1867

First part of these 24 hours strong
winds and squally from S W
heading W S W latter part moderate
lying of Canary Islands so ends
Lat 28.00 Long 14.47
