

Tuesday Dec 24. 1867

First part of these 24 hours
Commences with moderate winds
and clear weather from NNE
at sundown shorted sail headed
to Eastward latter part the same
steering W. so ends Lat 21.30 Long 19.16

Wednesday Dec 25. 1867

First part of these 24 hours commences
with fresh breezes and clear weather
from Eastward steering SSW
latter part the same so ends
Lat 20.24 Long 20.24

Thursday Dec 26. 1867

First part of these 24 hours
Commences with fresh breezes and
clear weather from NNE
steering SSW at sundown reefed
fore top sail latter part raining from
Eastward steering W. whole top sail
set so ends this day no obs

Friday Dec 27. 1867

First part of these 24 hours
Commences with fresh breezes and
raining from Eastward steering
W by N under short sail latter
strong winds and clear weather
from the north employed ship
Duty Lat 17.10 Long 22.24

Saturday Dec 28. 1867

First part of these 24 hours
Strong winds and clear from the
Northward latter part light winds and
clear at day lit sight salt Island

Sunday Dec 29. 1867

First part of these 24 hours
Commences with fresh breezes at
1 P M lowered 2 boats and went
at fishing latter part light winds and
clear weather from the northward at 5
A M Capt went ashore so ends

Monday Dec 30. 1867

First part of these 24 hours
Commences with moderate winds and
clear weather from the northward
At 11 A M left Island of St
Nicholas Bound to westward
latter part fresh breezes so ends

Tuesday Dec 31. 1867

First of these 24 hours commences
with fresh breezes and clear
weather from Eastward latter part
light winds from the same so ends

Wednesday Jan 1. 1868

First part of these 24 hours fresh
breezes from Eastward lying off and
on at St Anthony under short sail
latter part the same so ends this day

Thursday Jan 2. 1868

First of these 24 hours commences
with fresh breezes and clear weather
from Eastward latter part light and
at 8 A M Capt went on shore
at 12. Came on board at 9 lowered
the boat and got on Miller
so ends
