steered out of the bay so on

Friday Feb 14. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
Commences with fresh breezes
and cloudy the watch employed
ship duty latter part lite winds
and clear lying of Magerat
Island so ends

Saturday Feb 15. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
Commences with fresh breezes and
clear from Eastward at 5 P.M.
lowered for humpback being
shy did not strike latter
part moderate at 11 ft m. lowerd
for humpbacks and did not
strike so ends

Sunday Feb 16. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
Commences with strong winds
from Eastward at 6 P.M.
Anchored again latter part
Moderate winds at day lite got under
way and steered S.W. so ends

Monday Feb 17. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
Commences with lite breezes
latter part the same steering
S.W. all sail set so ends

Tuesday Feb 18. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
Commences with lite breezes
at 5 P.M. anchored of Biritu
Island latter part lite winds
from westward at day lite got under
way so ends this day

Wednesday Feb 19. 1868
First part of these 24 hours lite
winds from the north-east latter part
strong winds and hazy the watch
employed repairing sails so on

Thursday Feb 20. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
Commences with strong breezes
at 4 P.M. came to anchor latter
part lite wind at day lite got under way
so ends this day

Friday Feb 21. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
Commences with strong breezes at
7 P.M. anchored again latter fresh
winds the boats chasing whales so on

Saturday Feb 22. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
strong breezes boats chasing
whales latter part moderate so
ends this day

Sunday Feb 23. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
fresh breezes and clear at 6 P.M.
Anchored again latter part moderate
winds at 8 ft m the boat went on
shore so ends
