First part of these 24 hours
Commences with lile breads

latter part calm at day lile sighted
Humpback being shy did

Friday March 6. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
fresh breezes from Eastward
at 5 p m. anchored a gain
latter part lile weather at day lile
got under way so ends this day

Saturday March
the 7. 1868 First part of these
24 hours commences with strong
breads beating up to gulf latter
part lile and employed chasing
Humpback so ends this day

Sunday March 8. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
commences with moderate
winds from the Northward
employed chasing humpbacks
latter part the same so on

Monday March 9. 1868
First part of these 24 hours lile
breads lying to anchor latter part
the same 2 boats chasing humpbacks
L B got one so ends

Tuesday March 10. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
commences with lile breads
at night layed by humpback
latter part strong breezes employed
chasing humpbacks so ends this

Wednesday March 11. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
commences with strong breads
At 5 p m. anchored a gain latter
part strong breads lowered for humpback
L B got 2. so ends this day

Thursday March 12. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
commences with strong breads
and heavy weather lying by 2
Humpbacks latter part more moderate
At day lile called all hands and
commenced cutting at 11 a m finished
so ends this day

Friday March 13. 1868
First part of these 24 hours strong
winds all hands employed cutting
clubs latter part the same at 1 p m
started the works so ends

Saturday March 14. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
strong winds employed boiling
latter part moderate at 11 a m
finished boiling all hands employ
stowing down so ends
