Sunday April 5. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
Commences with strong threads
At 8 P. M. Anchored again
Latter part much the same
At anchor so ends this day

Monday April 6. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
Commences with strong threads
And clear weather latter part
the same at day lite. took our
Departure from Humphreys
ground bound to Northward
so ends

Tuesday April 7. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
Commences with strong threads
Beating under all sail latter
part the same at day, saw some
Whales going quick to windward
so ends

Wednesday April 8. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
Strong threads beating up under
all sail latter part moderate winds
the watch employed filling water
so ends this day

Thursday April 9. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
Commences with lite threads
heading by the wind N N E latter
part strong threads at 1 A. M.
reaped fore topsail so ends

Friday April 10. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
Commences with strong threads
And clear weather heading by the
wind N by E latter part the same
at 10 M. sighted small Island
so ends this day

Saturday April 11. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
Commences with fresh threads
heading by the wind N N E
with all set latter part strong threads
At day lite sighted the land
At 10 A. M. Carved a way fore
Top mast below the head band and
damaged the foresail all hands
employed clearing a way the pack
so ends this day

Sunday April the 12. 1868
First part of these 24 hours lite
And drizzling the watch
employed filling a new top
mast beating up to Island of Eustatia
under short sail latter part the same
At 10 A. M. Capt went on shore so
ends this day

Monday April 13. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
Commences lite winds and clear
weather from Eastward latter part
moderate at 3 A. M. Anchored
At Eustatia at day lite employed
in sending up fore top mast
so ends this day
