

Monday May 4. 1868

First part of these 24 hours
fresh breezes and clear
weather from Eastward
latter part the same at day lit
called all hands and commenced
washing the ship at 9 a m
finished so ends this day

Tuesday May 5. 1868

First part of these 24 hours
Commences with moderate
winds from Eastward ship
ready for sea latter part the
same the watch employed
washing the ship so ends

Wednesday May 6

1868. First part of these
24 hours commences with lite
breezes and clear weather
employed painting the lines
latter part the same so ends

Thursday May 7 1868

First part of these 24 hours
Commences with fresh breezes
from Eastward at 7 p m.
sailed from Barbados steering
N W under short sail
latter part moderate at day
lite sighted Island of St. Lucia
so ends this day

Friday May 8. 1868

First part of these 24 hours
Commences with lite breezes at 1
p m. tacked up to the wharf at
St. Lucia and commenced filing
water latter part the same all
hands employed filing water
so ends this day

Saturday May 9. 1868

First part of these 24 hours
Commences with moderate winds
and clear weather at finished
filing water and got under
way at 4 p m. Anchored again
for wood. latter part the same at
day lite called all hands and
commenced wooding at noon
got of 6 boats loads of wood so
ends this day

Sunday May 10. 1868

First part of these 24 hours
Commences with lite breezes and
clear weather at 6 p m. got the last
boat load of wood on board made
in all 8 boats loads latter part the
same steering N N W all sail set

Monday May 11. 1868

First part of these 24 hours
Commences with calm latter part
moderate winds from Eastward
steering N N W at day lite
sighted the land at 10 a m
Anchored at Enstatia so
ends this day
