First part of these 24 hours commences
with lite ares and cloudy Employea
 ship duty Latter part the same
 So Ends this day

Thursday July the 9. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
 Calm and cloudy at 5 P.M. rose
 Black fish Sownea 3 boats and
 got 4. Latter part the same at 8 A.M.
 rose black fish Sownea 3 boats
 and got 4 again So Ends this

Friday July the 10. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
 Commences with lite winds and
 cloudy at 7 P.M. rose a Schooner
 chasing a large Sownea 2 boats
 Chased untill dark Latter part the
 same Employea mince in black
 fish blubber So Ends

Saturday July the 11. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
 Commences with calm boiling
 Black blubber Latter part lite
 winds and clear weather Employea
 filling barrels So Ends

Sunday July the 12. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
 Commences with fine weather
 at sundown shorten sail and
 heada to north Latter part lite
 winds and squally So Ends

Monday July the 13. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
 Commences with lite ares and squally
 from the south Latter the same
 steering at 12 M. with all sail set
 So Ends this

Tuesday July the 14. 1868
First part of these 24 hours commences
 with fresh breezes and smoky
 weather at 6 P.M. spoke Schooner
 Gifford and Capt come on board
 Latter part strong winds so end

Wednesday July the 15. 1868
First part of these 24 hours lite
 winds from S S E Latter part calm
 Employea painting boat So Ends

Thursday July the 16. 1868
First part of these 24 hours commences
 with calm Latter part the same
 So Ends this day

Friday July the 17. 1868
First part of these 24 hours
 Commences with calm at sundown
 shorten sail Latter part lite winds
 So Ends this day
