

Remarks on board Ship Statera

Thursday January 23rd 1840

First part wind light weather cloudy Middle part took a light air from the S. course NW & Latter part fine pleasant weather with a light air from the S. saw Grampus's and Porpoise's sea
Latitude by Ch 38.20 Long by Ch 44.30

Friday January 24th 1840

First part fine pleasant weather with a light air from the S. course NW & started 2 barrels of Water Middle part light air Latter part the same from the S. & B. ends with the best nets
Latitude by Ch 38.30 Long by Ch 45.

Saturday January 25th 1840

First part light air from the S. & B. sea weather Middle part also Latter part stiff breeze from S. & B. & course NW with all sail set saw Grampus's
Latitude by Ch 40.39 Long by Ch 49.

Sunday January 26th 1840

First part cloudy weather with a stiff breeze from the S. & B. & course NW going quick. Completed in repairing the fore topsail Middle part at 9 AM took in sail to close reef topsails blowing a gale from S. & B. at 3 PM moderate made some sail wind weather Latter part very squally with rain under short sail
Latitude by Account 42.28 Long by Ch 49.3

Monday January 27th 1840

First part squally with some rain Middle part the same wind NW made and took in sail between the squalls Latter part blowing a strong breeze from the NW under South reef topsails at 4 AM tacked to the W. and spoke the Steamer of London Capt. Bernard from the Pacific bound to London with 2000 lbs of sperm oil sea calm as new lib and staysail
Latitude by Ch 43.30 Long by Ch 50.

Tuesday January 28th 1840

First part squally with a moderate breeze from NW made more sail set NW & B. sail lowered for night watches but could not strike & took a Porpoise Latter part stiff breeze
Latitude 44.20 Long 50.

Remarks

Wednesday January 29th 1840

First part stiff breeze from the NW heading SW all sail set rigged in the W. lib boom and sent down the fore mast Middle part at 12 close reef the topsails blowing a gale from NW & Latter part made some sail but took in again
Latitude by Ch 45.40 Long by Ch 50.33

Thursday January 30th

First part blowing a strong gale from NW heading SW under 3 close reef topsails Middle part more moderate Latter part light winds from the S. heading to the W. Embarked in repairing sails
Latitude by Ch 46.32 Long by Ch 50.50 & Ch

Friday January 31st 1840

First part light air & calm at 7 PM took a breeze from the NW made all sail tows NW Middle part at 2 AM took in and close reef in the topsails blowing strong Latter part moderate made all sail at 10 1/2 AM wind S. & B. took in all sail at blowing a gale of wind with cloudy weather sea
Latitude by Acc 47.52 Long by Ch 52

Saturday January 1st

First part blowing a gale from the S. & B. course NW under main topsails & fore sail Middle part moderate made sail Latter part wind to NW to S. squally with rain & Breeze repairing sails
Latitude by Ch 47.33 Long by Ch 52.52

Sunday January 2nd

First part calm Middle part took a breeze from the S. & B. course NW Latter part at 7 AM saw several large Whales lowered and at 10 struck one with a strong breeze from NW with squalls of rain sea
Latitude by Ch 48. Long by Ch 53.12

Monday February 3rd

First part blowing a gale of wind from the NW at 2 PM took the whale alongside Mr. [redacted] Middle part lay by blowing a gale Latter part weather began cutting the whale
Latitude by Ch 48.37 Long by Ch 57.20
