First part running off to the W. at night spoke the barque ship
Montezuma of Liverpool Capt. Lelands 22 days from Mozambique
with Mack bound to Valparaiso Middle part lay by latter part
run off W. S. C. as usual

First part fine weather with a moderate breeze heading to the S. W.
Middle part the same latter part tacked to the N. E. at all sail

it is now over six weeks since we have seen a sperm whale spout
Middle part standing to the N. E. latter part at daylight saw
and lowered for a school of large whales at 9 A.M. struck and
drowned at 11 struck again another whale and at noon
took him to the ship and began butting

First part fine weather with stiff trade being 9 months
into the day and have seen Whales 10 times and have
taken ten whales which makes us nearly 600 barrels
Middle part heading to the N. E. latter part some rain began
to stem down oil see

Saturday 11th of July

First part at night finished storing off 10th of oil see
and made sail standing to the S. W. Middle part much
the same latter part fine weather with a fine breeze
employed in washing ship inside & out

First part fine weather standing to the S. W. Middle part
much the same latter part stiff breeze saw finished

First part stiff trade heading to the N. W. under single reef
at night tacked ship Middle part moderate latter part
much the same made sail heading to the N. E.

lowered for a large whale struck him and took
him alongside see Middle part lay by the
Moon full tomorrow
