

Remarks on board Ship Station
Saturday March 6th 1841

First part strong single reef topsail here from S.W. &
standing to the S.W. trying hard to get to the South with
a N.W. current & employed variously Middle part strong
wind and clear weather latter part much the same at 4 P.M.
saw a lone whale going very quick to windward put off for him
but did not catch him weather muggy
Latitude of B. 42.1 Longitude of the 75.50

Sunday March 7th

First part moderate weather wind as 24.4 Maclellan part winds
light latter part thick heavy, weather with as moderate wind at 24.4
with rain and fog. Head
Latitude of ice Longitude of ice

Monday March 8th

Partly rainy weather with the winds moderate at 4 N. 44
 At 2 PM wind at South blowing a hard gale but in all but
 the latter part much the same. In the past rather more moderate
 latitude of Ch 41.38 long of Ch 77.22

Tuesday March 9th

First part moderate middle sail and tacked in shore
Middle part stiff breeze latter part took in boath and stored &
the 1st with rainy weather
Latitude of Bl 41.48 Longitude of Bl 76.30

Wednesday March 10th

First part strong winds from the North with rain tonight
 Having a gale took in the Topsail and 1/2 course of Middle's part
 Having land at 3 AM took in the Foresail and have her too
 Latter part still blowing a gale from N. W.
 Latitude of Ch 43.40 Long of Ch 72.20

Thursday March 11th

First part still blowing, a gale from N. into the Trench and still in shore. Middle part backed off shore. Latter part still blowing a gale.

Latitude of Bk 44.0 Longitude of Bk 27.38

Friday March 12th

First part wind moderate from the NW Middle part much
the same latter part left off & E made all sail with a
heavy swell at noon saw Euapo bearing S E 1/2 E
Latitudes 6 3/4 43.28 Long of Ene 171.50

On the Coast of Chittis
Saturday March 18th 1841

First part good weather with a moderate wind from the S
steering S. Middle part very hot latter part fine weather
all sail set rigged 24 lbs. down & 24 lbs. up S. Canal
Latitudes of 66 42. 50 Long of 66 15. 0

Sunday March 14th

First part fine weather with a moderate wind from the
E. course N. of S. some Chilean. Middle part strong wind
latter part having half a gale from the S. course N.
Latitude of Ch 40.1 Long of Ch 74.40

Monday March 15^h

First part blowing strong from the S^W running along shore
Middle part wind light latter part at daylight saw the
Island of Mocha having S & E 30 miles at 8 A.M. put off
for 4 large whales going to the S^W quick ⁷⁰ to & took one
to the ship and began cutting
Latitudes & Rec off Saint Mary:

Innsley March 16th

First part fine smooth weather with a light air at 4 PM
 finished butter. Middle part lay by. Latter part began
 to hail weather fine wind light at 10th. S. D. ends
 Latitude of 66 Long of 64

Wednesday March 17th

Part parts fine weather with a light wind from
the S.W. running along towards Tokachura. Middle
part lay by. Latter part stiff breeze from the S.W.
being off St. Maria Islands left off C.R. & for
Tokachura still beating. L. End Karachina in sight.

Thursday March 18th

First part stiff breeze from the North at 2 PM
entered the Bay of Delahoune at 6 PM came to
anchor in 6 fms. The Middle part finished
hoisting. Latter part blowing strong employed in cleaning ship

Friday March 19th

First part strong wind from the South employed in
charing ship and unloading up the Royal Mast & yards
latter part employed in getting the East ready for winter
with one watch on there
