

Salcedo

Saturday March 20th 1841

First part light wind from the N^W took anchor and went in shore further two Middle part Wm Evans discharged. The Capt order latter part chastised him for it.

Sunday March 21st

First part took one water cask on shore to fill the with one watch to liberty. Middle part lay by latter part took off the water and made Potatoes.

Monday March 22nd

First part fine weather with all hands employed. Latter part much the same.

Tuesday March 23

First part fine weather with a fine breeze. Latter part got all ready for sea.

Wednesday March 24th

First part discharged the Steward Wm Scott and shipped another one of the name of James Hill advanced to the Consul at Valparaiso 60 dollars on sixty dollars on Wm Scott's account for which I took a receipt for it and for his discharge. D. T. Folger Middle part at 8 PM Henry Phillips third officer of Ship Station of Manchester requested permission of the Captain to have liberty with a boat & crew to go ashore on board of the Ship Hiram of New Bedford. Liberty was given him to go on board of Ship Hiram with very strict orders to be back to the ship in one hour time and on pretence whatever to land on the shore as the ship was already under the point of sailing. At 10 PM the boat came back to the ship but the abovesaid Phillips had landed and deserted and sent the boat back.

Latter part at daylight went ashore with the boat heard nothing of Phillips at 8 AM got underweigh with a light breeze from the N^W. Stowed Anchors & chains and got ready for whaling.

From Port to Sea

Thursday March 25th 1841

First part fine stiff breeze from the N^W course 1448 double reefed the Topsails two Middle part strong wind at 3 watches latter part began stowing oil &c. Latitude by Ob 34.27 Long by Ob 73.30

Friday March 26th

First part finished stowing with a fine breeze Middle part wind light from the N^W heading 14 Latter part began coopersing in provisions &c. Latitude by Ob 33.51 Long by Ob 73.40

Saturday March 27th

First part fine breeze from the N^W at 4 1/2 PM saw a school of Whales but off but they were going so quick we could not catch them. Middle part wind & heading 14 PM Latter part strong breeze and a very heavy swell employed in coopersing meat & saws. Two barrels Latitude by Ob 33.12 Long by Ob 73.18

Sunday March 28th

First part strong breeze from the N^W heading 14 PM under double reef Topsails finished coopersing meat Middle part strong with a heavy swell Latter part stiff breeze from the N^W saw the Island of Juan Fernandez bearing S 10 miles S. End Latitude by Ob 33.20 Long by Ob 73.30

Monday March 29th

First part fine weather with a moderate breeze from S^W Middle part lay too Latter part saw nothing of the land saw and spoke Ship Edwards of and from Hudson 113 days with 60 lbs Capt Daggett. S. End Latitude by Ob 32.47 Long by Ob 73.0

Tuesday March 30th

First part fine weather heading to the N^W employed in unhooking and hooking sails Middle part stiff breeze Latter part saw Juan bearing S^W & saw a fin back Latitude by Ob 33.1 Long by Ob 73.45

Wednesday March 31st

First part stiff breeze from N^W heading S^W Middle part much the same Latter part saw the Island of Mapefuro bearing S^W 40 miles & at 7 AM saw a Ship bound to the N^W
