Sunday May 23rd 1841

First part fine weather still cooping ice
arrived ship Eliza Adams of N.B. 30 mths 200
with 2250 Latter part sailed ship Eliza Adams
and United States on a cruise &c.

Monday May 24th

First part fine weather at night finished
cooping our ice &c. Latter part washed ship

Tuesday May 25th

First part fine weather employed in cooping
or should say cleaning ship Latter part began
to paint &c.

Wednesday May 26th

First part employed in painting ship Latter
part much the same

Thursday May 27th

First part painting inside Latter part
much the same S. Encls

Friday May 28th

First part employed in painting ship &c.
with one watch on liberty and &c.
Latter part much the same

Saturday May 29th

First part employed in painting Latter the same

Sunday May 30th

First part painting Latter part finished

Monday 31st

First part getting ready to sail Latter part
Jim Johnson & Francis sweetest

Tuesday June 1st

First part already to sail Latter part caught our
slaves took them on board and confined them
