

Off Shore Provinces in
Saturday July 31st 1841
First part starting into heading to the sea
and moving very strong. Middle & latter parts
much the same. nothing in sight
Latitude of Ch. 3.15 S Long. of Ch. 116.23

Sunday, 1st August 1st
First part moving strong heading to the sea
Middle & latter parts much the same
Latitude of Ch. 2.9 Long. of Ch. 115.45

Monday August 2nd
First part strong wind heading to the sea
Middle part total eclipse of the Moon
Latter part stiff breeze heading to the sea
Latitude of Ch. 0.64 Long. of Ch. 115.10

Tuesday August 3rd
First part wind light at 12 PM saw and
put off for a school of four whales struck one
and showed the others in the distance
Middle part heading to the sea Latter part
tacked to the sea at 7 PM saw and put off for
whales struck two and began to tow them to the ship
Latitude of Ch. 0.22 S Long. of Ch. 115

Wednesday August 4th
First part took the whales to the ship and
cut one in and put off for more but
got none Middle part light air Latter part
finished cutting the whales and began to herd
Latitude of Ch. 0.50 S Long. of Ch. 115.30

Thursday August 5th
First part wind moderate with a very strong
northern current Middle and latter parts
good breeze heading to the sea & Ench. sailing
Latitude of Ch. 1.20 S Long. of Ch. 115.27

Friday Aug 6th
First part stiff breeze heading to the sea
Middle part stiff breeze Latter part still
Latitude of Ch. 1.11 Long. of Ch. 115.59

The Longitudes of 115. West
Saturday August 7th 1841
First part stiff breeze heading to the sea at 3 PM
finished sailing & Middle part much current
Latter part stiff breeze heading to the sea
Latitude of Ch. 0.15 S Long. of Ch. 116.35

Sunday August 8th 1841
First part stiff breeze heading to the sea
saw Finbacks going quick Middle part
heading to the sea Latter part the same
Latitude of Ch. 0.51 S Long. of Ch. 117.25

Monday August 9th
First part stiff breeze heading to the sea at
5 PM saw a large Whaler going to the sea
put off but saw nothing more of him it being
night Middle part ran off for him Latter part
luffed to the wind and beat to windward but saw
nothing more of him to Ench
Latitude of Ch. 1.02 Long. of Ch. 118.19

Tuesday August 10th
First part stiff breeze heading to the windward
Middle part heading to the sea Latter part
tacked to the sea and began to sail in strong air
Latitude of Ch. 1.20 Long. of Ch. 118

Wednesday Aug 11th
First part fine weather with a moderate breeze
from the S.E. heading to the sea Middle part
tacked to the sea Latter part at 11 PM saw a
school of Whales put off for them going very quick
to the windward and very shy
Latitude of Ch. 1.02 Long. of Ch. 118.17

Thursday August 12th
First part moderate breeze in chase of whales
but got nothing they being very shy and going quick
Middle part heading to windward
Latter part much the same & saw nothing
Latitude of Ch. 1.0 Long. of Ch. 118.32
