

Remarks on board Ship Station

Wednesday, January 12th 1842

First part fine weather with a moderate wind from the NW Course East Middle part wind W latter part wind NW strong south under the Topails rigger in the By jib boom at noon rainy

Latitude of Co. 41.18 Long. 81.30

Thursday, January 13th 1842

First part rainy weather with a southerly wind from the NW Course East at night wind WSW Middle part much the same latter part moderate made all sail wind WSW Course East saw a number of Timbucks passed through a drift of green water

Latitude of Co. 42.3 Long. 78.40

Friday, January 14th

First part fine weather with a moderate wind at NW Course East at night the Royal Mast & Middle part wind WSW with a very heavy swell latter part water green with a moderate wind from the NW Course East saw Timbucks

Latitude of Co. 42.44 Long. 76.

Saturday, January 15th

First part strong wind from the NW weather thick mingled the thick sails & booms at night took in sails and here too heading to the NW. Morning strong Middle part strong wind from the NW with rain latter part rainy weather with the wind W saw 2 ships at 11 & 12 spoke the Tenes Coffin Bailey Bank 1800

On. Chills

Sunday, January 16th 1842

First part rough weather with a stiff breeze from the NW at night 4 ships in sight with the Islands of Pisco bearing S 64 E 25 miles Middle part strong wind from the NW latter part heavy squally weather saw the Tenes Coffin Pisco bearing S 64 E 10 miles towed off

Latitude of Co. 43.30 Long. 75.10

Monday, January 17th

First part squally with hail & rain very rough Morning a gale from the NW at night took in the Topails saw two ships Middle & latter part strong a hard gale from NW boats turned up

Latitude of Co. 43.01 Long. 74.50

Tuesday, January 18th

First part strong wind saw 2 ships Middle part wind at south latter part more moderate made all sail heading in for the land of Chilo with the Tenes Coffin 4 miles to windward of us

Latitude of Co. 42.40 Long. 74.40

Wednesday 19th

First part strong wind from the south at 2 P.M. took off from the land under the Topails & at night took in the Topails at strong almost a gale with the Tenes Coffin nearly 20 miles to windward Middle part much the same latter part more moderate land 30 miles off

Latitude 42.42
