

Coast of Chile

Thursday, January 20th 1842

First part strong wind from the S. spoke the ship John Adams of and from Nantucket 4 1/2 months clean Stockman Master in co with L. Coffin Middle part moderate latter part saw 4 sail wind light at South fine weather 20 miles from land

Latitude of Co 42.40 Long

Friday Jan 21st

First part light air from South 3 sail in sight Middle part light air latter part wind at South during N.W. saw one sail saw the land 30 miles off

Latitude of Co 43. Long 74.50

Saturday January 22nd

First part with a strong wind at S during South saw 2 ships far at night weather thick & heavy during the S. Middle part much the same latter part wind at South saw 2 ships

Latitude of Co 44.10 Long 75.15

Sunday January 23rd

First part fine weather signalized with a ship that we called the Envoy of Providence at night spoke ship Pacific Collins of New Bedford 20th 1700 Middle part blowing strong latter part blowing strong with Guano bearing N.W. 30 miles at 3 A.M. saw a whale put off but got nothing saw the York of Edgerton take a whale & L. Enos very much

Latitude 44.0 Long 75

Remarks on board

Monday, January 24th 1842

First part blowing strong with squalls of rain from the S.W. passed the ship Cataract of Nantucket at night Guano bearing S.W. 25 miles with 5 ships in sight Middle part fog too latter part saw the Cataract & York sailing with squally weather S. Enos 4 ships in sight

Latitude of Co 43.48 Long 75.10

Tuesday, January 25th

First part wind at N.W. with a moderate breeze at night Guano bearing S.W. 15 miles one ship in sight Middle part light air latter part fine weather with a light air from the S. Guano bearing S.W. saw the York sailing & 7 leagues

Latitude of Co 43.31 Long

Wednesday, Jan 26th

First part fine smooth weather with a light breeze from the S. saw the Pacific & Cataract at night Guano bearing S.W. 35 miles latter part fine weather spoke the Cataract 20th 1100 L. Enos 4 ships in sight

Latitude of Co 43.30 Long

Thursday 27th

First part fine weather with a light breeze spoke ship Marthes of Nantucket 6th into clean latter part heading at the S.W. & wind S.W. saw Finbacks & Blackfish and 3 ships

Chiles 20 miles Latitude Long
