

Remarks

Friday, January 28th 1842

First part spoke ship Lucas Coffin had seen nothing since we last saw her under 14th thick rainy weather Middle part calm latter part under 14th Leading to the 1st saw 4 ships no signs of Whales

Latitude of 6th 43. long 70

Saturday 29th

First part spoke the ship Navigator of Nantucket Capt Fisher South 20th Middle part under South latter part fine weather 4 ships in sight Quavo having East 20 miles no Whales yet

Latitude of 6th 43.31 long

Sunday 30th

First part fine smooth weather with a light air from South 4 ships in sight Middle & latter under 14th thick & rainy 2 ships in sight 1. Enes dull ground

Latitude of 6th long of 6th

Monday 31st

First part fine weather with a light breeze from 1st saw 3 ships Middle part much the same latter part steering to the 14th with a light air spoke the Weather & Lucas Coffin &

Latitude of 6th 44. long of 6th

Tuesday February 1st 1842

First part fine weather with a stiff breeze from the 1st 2 ships in sight Lane 30 miles distant Middle part steering a gale from the South latter part steering a strong gale kept off 14 with a breeze in sight saw the Lane 30 miles distant
Latitude 41.30 long

From Quavo Island

1842

Thursday February 2nd

First part steering a strong gale of wind from the South steering North under a close Fore & Main Tapsail & Tarsail with the Lane just in sight bearing East at night took in the Fore Tapsail & Tarsail weather very rugged Middle part steering a hard gale course 14.44 latter part rather more moderate under single reef with the sea very rugged course 14 under South

Latitude of 6th 38.50 long 74.30

Friday Feb 3rd

First part steering a gale of wind from the South course 14 with clear weather at 2 PM saw the Island of Mocha bearing 14.8 20 miles at night took in the Tapsails and Tarsails the ship too leading 4.54 Middle part steering a strong gale latter part at daylight kept off 14 set single reef Tapsails with a strong gale from South saw humpbacks & saw
Latitude of 6th 37.13 long of 6th 74.5

Saturday Feb 4th

First part steering a gale of wind from the South steering along shore 14.8 at night close reefed the Fore and Main Tapsails. Minors furled Middle part rather more moderate latter part steering a gale at 6 AM saw 2 sperm Whales going to windward quick turned for them but did not see them more

Latitude of 6th 35.13 long of 6th

Saturday February 5th

First part more moderate set the M & T sail course 14.8 under South Middle part under light latter part set up Royal Masts & yards under 14 weather thick saw the Lane 12 miles off 4.12

Latitude of 6th 34.0 long

Lane 8 miles
