

Remarks on board

Wednesday July 27th 1842

First part stiff breeze heading to the S. in hopes of seeing some whales. Middle part strong trades. Latter part much the same employed in repairing sails taken to the N. with very dull times. S. Good.

Latitude of G. 5.0 S Long. 122.50

Thursday July 28th

First part stiff breeze heading to the N. employed in repairing sails. Middle part moderate. Latter part stiff breeze under whole topsails. saw pumps.

Latitude of G. 3.38 Long. 122.42

Friday July 29th

First part moderate breeze employed in repairing sails. saw Perkins's. Middle part much the same. Latter part fine weather heading to the N. S. Good.

Latitude of G. 2.24 Long. 122.48

Saturday July 30th

First part fine weather heading to the N. Middle part the same. Latter part the same. dull times & dull grounds.

Latitude of G. 1.17 Long. 122.50

Sunday 31st

First part fine weather heading to the N. with a strong S.W. current. Middle & Latter part the same. No change.

Latitude of G. 1.2 S Long. 122

Ship Station.

Monday August 1st 1842

First part fine weather. very smooth with all sail out heading to the N. with 3 ships in sight. Middle part much the same light air. Latter part much the same. three ships in sight. S. Good. wind light.

Latitude of G. 0.45 S Long. 122

Tuesday August 2nd

First part fine smooth weather with a very light air heading to the N. at night. Tacked to the S. Middle part saw two ships. Latter part saw several ships one on sailing. S. Good. employed in washing ships.

Latitude of G. 0.58 S Long. 122.44

Wednesday August 3rd

First part fine smooth weather spoke large ships. Pantheon of N. Bedford Capt. Tabor 12mth 220 and ship Queller Clarke of Newport Capt. Griswold 18th with 1000 lbs. Middle part parted with them. Latter part wind very light. S. Good.

Latitude of G. 1.6 S Long. 123

Thursday August 4th

First part saw the ship Dec of Fair Haven and a number of other ships. Middle part wind very light. Latter part at sea. wind light. S. Good.

Latitude of G. 1.12 Long. 123.24

Friday August 5th

First part fine weather. wind light. Middle part much the same. Latter part at daylight saw a large number of whales at 2 & 4 m. saw them strike a whale. parted off with our boat. and gave chase to them. Latitude of G. 1.38 Long. 123.50
