Saturday August 6th

First part wind very light with our boats in pursuit of whales. At night gave up the chase. the whales going to quick for us to catch them. saw two sails. Middle part wind moderate. Latter part saw two sails S. E. on

Latitude of O. 1.48 S Long 123.55

Sunday August 7th

First part fine weather with a whole sail breeze. Heading to the N.E. saw a large ship sailing. Middle part stiff breeze. Latter part spoke the large Russell of N.B. Capt. Barnwell. 1000 tons. S. E. on as usual drifting S. E. towards quick

Latitude of O. 1.35 Long 124.5

Monday August 8th

First part fine weather heading to the N.E. of the mines with the Russell out of sight S. W. towards. Middle part wind light. Latter part wind light nothing in sight and a strong S. E. current

Latitude of O. 0.42 S Long 124.48

Tuesday August 9th

First part fine smooth weather with a light breeze heading to the N.E. with very dull times. - the darkest time that we have seen the voyage and a slim chance of seeing any thing better this season. Middle part much the same. Latter part saw a number of Timbuck & S. E. on as usual

Latitude of O. 0.25 S Long 125

Wednesday August 10th

First part light air heading to the N.E. with a strong S. E. current. Middle part much the same. Latter part hooked to the S. E. 100 S. E. on. Latitude of O. 0.28 S Long 125.30

Thursday August 11th 1842

First part fine breeze. heading to the S. E. at 4 PM spoke ship Japan Capt. Dickcote. 1100 tons. Middle part parted with her. Latter part hooked to the N.E. saw the other ship S. E. on

Latitude of O. 1.20 S Long 126.28

Friday August 12th

First part fine breeze saw Blackfish & Porpoise at night saw the Japan on the weather cleared. Middle part wind light weather smooth. Latter part much the same no appearance of whales

Latitude of O. 1.02 S Long 126.42

Saturday August 13th

First part in company with the Japan. Middle part parted she being bound to the westward. Latter part heading to the N.E. with a very strong S. E. current and light air. going to the westward quick

Latitude of O. 1.35 Long 127.10

Sunday August 14th

First part light wind heading to the N.E. saw a large Middle part nearly calm. Latter part wind light

Latitude of O. 0.20 S Long 128

Monday August 15th

First part light air thick misty weather. heading N.E. at night spoke ship of Boston Capt. Davis 1000 tons. Middle part moderate breeze. Latter part much the same employed in repairing the jib & heading to the N.E.
