

At Tahiti

Sunday September 25th 1842

First part lying at anchor sent one watch on shore. It must be the latter part employed in taking off water and making beds &c

Monday September 26th

First part good weather with more and then a squall of rain. Latter part taking of water &c. Discharged William Coffin, Bob Mitchell, Francis Lepus, James Webb & Louis Deverant & paid them off

Tuesday Septem 27th

First part sent the boat for Potatoes. Latter part came back with some & taking off water

Wednesday Sept 28th

First part fine weather employed in watering. Latter part rainy weather &c

Thursday Sept 29th

First part rainy weather. Middle part clear. Latter part good weather finished making beds

Friday Sept 30th

First part good weather, stowing water & caulking ship arrived the schooner Emerald with the crew of the wrecked ship. Captain of R.P. Capt Mayhew. Latter part employed in watering and watering

Saturday October

At Tahiti

Saturday October 1st 1842

First part employed in watering & watering and other jobs. Latter part which is Sabbath day with the natives sent the crew on shore & attend church

Sunday October 2nd

First part fair weather employed variously. Latter part much the same

Monday October 3rd

First part employed in laying up Baskets. Latter part much the same &c

Tuesday October 4th

First part employed variously on the Baskets and other jobs. Latter part much the same employment with rainy weather

Wednesday October 5th

First part rainy weather. Took of six barrels of Potatoes. Latter part employed variously &c

Thursday October 6th

First part squally weather. Latter part at 7 AM the first Mr. Evans, a coloured man, in ivory for displaying orders. At 10 AM took him out and put him & his child

Friday Oct 7th

First part Middle & Latter part with the men on shore and water
